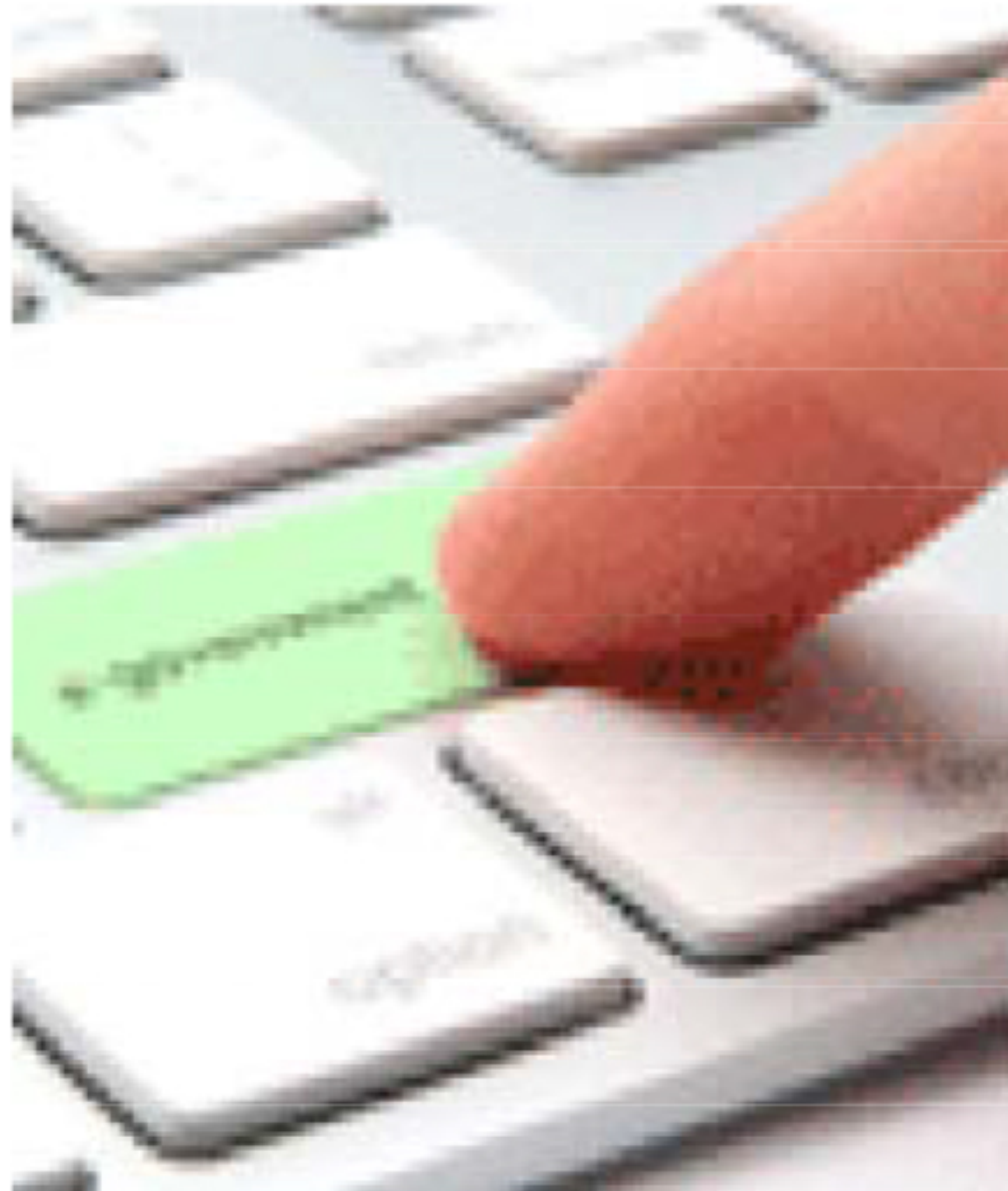

The National University of Singapore's Institute of Systems Science (NUS-ISS) has signed a three-year research and training agreement with e-government solutions and services provider CrimsonLogic.'

The areas of collaboration include applied research activities, co-delivery of overseas training programs, and capacity building promotion in the overseas markets.

Khoong Chan Meng, Director and CEO of NUS-ISS, said the institute is deepening its involvement with key economic sectors, including e-government, so it can tailor its programs for optimal contextual impact.

Under the agreement, both NUS-ISS and CrimsonLogic will extend their applied research activities, ranging from case studies development, to research papers. Domain experts from both
